Pat from Waste Management talked about how prices are getting higher due to COVID. More people are working from home and therefore are recycling and creating more garbage.

Discussion was held regarding the increases of a new contract. The first year 15% increase then 3 ¾ increase each year over that.

BE IT RESOLVED, North Collins Town Board approves the 5 year extension for Waste Management to continue garbage pickup for the Town of North Collins.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, Effective January 1, 2023 and each January 1 thereafter, there will be a fixed annual price increase of 3.75%.

Code Enforcement received a call from the owner asking for another week and it will be all cleaned up. Also, Ann asked about the speed limit on Marshfield Road to be changed to 45mph.

Moritz - Stated that our community is different then Hamburg and currently no one is breaking any laws because there is no law.

Gerry Edwards – Could a special use permit be issued if needed?

Tobia - He would like to table it and request the opinion of the public and refer back to the Planning Board to address the businesses not on the list.
